Grading

Grading in this course will be based on a weighted percentages system. The grading value breakdown is as follows:

Interim Assessments (Quizzes, Blog Entries, Short Projects) - 35%

Summative Assessments (Tests, Long-Term Projects, Essays, Speeches) - 65%

Final Course Grade = Quarter 1 Grade - 45%, Quarter 2 Grade - 45%, Final Exam - 10%

Notice of assignments/assessments will be given well in advance. Rubrics will be attached to all essays and projects to display point distribution for the corresponding assignment.

Homework

In this course, homework will primarily consist of blog entries, reading, watching videos, working on projects, and studying. You may have noticed that homework is ungraded. You are high school students, many of whom are upperclassmen, and homework is your responsibility. It is ultimately your choice whether or not you complete your homework. However, it will be difficult to effectively participate in class activities or discussions if you are unprepared for class. There will also be tasks in class that are directly related to the previous night's homework. Make the right choice!

Tardiness and Absences

With regards to tardiness and absences, WRHS rules and consequences apply. If you have an excused absence, you have that number of days to make up the assignment or take the owed test or quiz. If you have an unexcused absence, your work will automatically be considered late.

Supplies
